**FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS  
of LAW and BOARD ORDER  
No. 09-0042-PHR**

10 On May 6<sup>th</sup>, 2009 the Arizona State Board of Pharmacy ("Board") considered the State's  
11 Motion to Deem Allegations Admitted at the Board of Pharmacy Offices, 1700 W. Washington Street,  
12 Room 312, in Phoenix, Arizona. Elizabeth Campbell, Assistant Attorney General, appeared on behalf  
13 of the State. Respondent did not appear.

14 On May 6<sup>th</sup>, 2009 the Board granted the State's Motion to Deem Allegations Admitted. Based  
15 upon A.R.S. § 32-1927.01(O) and the Complaint and Notice of Hearing No. 09-0042-PHR filed in this  
16 matter, the Board issues the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and Order revoking  
17 Respondent's license.

19 **FINDINGS OF FACT**

20  
21 1. On September 30, 2008, Respondent was convicted of attempted theft of a credit card  
22 or obtaining a credit card by fraudulent means, a class 6 undesignated felony.

23 2. Attempted theft of a credit card or obtaining a credit card by fraudulent means is a  
24 crime of moral turpitude.

25 3. At no point prior to the conviction, which was reported to the Board by the court, did  
26 Respondent notify the Board that she had been criminally charged.

1 CONCLUSIONS of LAW

2  
3 1. The Board possesses jurisdiction over the subject matter and over Respondent pursuant  
4 to A.R.S. § 32-1901 *et seq.*

5 2. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-1927.01(A)(1), the Board may discipline a pharmacy  
6 technician trainee who has engaged in unprofessional conduct.

7 3. The conduct and circumstances described above constitutes unprofessional conduct  
8 pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-1901.01(C)(6) (Committing a felony, whether or not involving moral  
9 turpitude, or a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude, or any drug related offense. In either case,  
10 conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction or a plea of no contest is conclusive evidence of the  
11 commission.).

12 4. The conduct and circumstances described above constitutes unprofessional conduct  
13 pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-3208(A) (A health professional who has been charged with a misdemeanor  
14 involving conduct that may affect patient safety or a felony after receiving or renewing a license or  
15 certificate must notify the health professional's regulatory board in writing within ten working days  
16 after the charge is filed).

17 ORDER

18  
19 In view of the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Board issues the following  
20 Order:

21 Pharmacy Technician license number T013239 issued to Respondent is **REVOKED**. A.R.S. §  
22 32-1927.01(B)(1).

24 RIGHT TO PETITION FOR REHEARING OR REVIEW

25 Respondent is hereby notified of the right to petition for a rehearing or review by filing a  
26 petition with the Board's Executive Director within thirty (30) days after service of this Order. A.R.S.  
27 § 41-1092.09. The petition must set forth legally sufficient reasons for granting a rehearing. A.C.C.  
28 R4-23-128. Service of this order is effective five (5) days after date of mailing. If a motion for  
29

1 rehearing is not filed, the Board's Order becomes effective thirty-five (35) days after it is mailed to  
2 Respondent.

3 Respondent is further notified that the filing of a motion for rehearing is required to preserve  
4 any rights of appeal to the Superior Court.
