**FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS
of LAW and BOARD ORDER
No. 11-0021-PHR**

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11 Pursuant to Notice of Hearing Number 11-0021-PHR (Notice) this matter came before
12 the Arizona State Board of Pharmacy (Board) on January 27, 2011.

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14 Steve Haiber, president, presided with vice-president Dan Milovich and members
15 James W. Foy, JoAnne Galindo, Dennis McAllister, Nona Rosas, Kyra Locnikar, John Musil
16 and Tom Van Hassel in attendance.

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18 The State was represented by the Office of the Attorney General, Elizabeth Campbell,
19 Assistant Attorney General, Licensing and Enforcement Section. Christopher Munns, of the
20 Solicitor General's Section of the Attorney General's Office was present to provide
21 independent legal advice to the Board. Cameron Garbrick, (Respondent) was not present and
22 was not represented by an attorney. The Board, after considering the testimony and evidence
23 presented, hereby issues the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order.
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FINDINGS OF FACT

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1. In July 2010, Respondent presented a prescription for Phenergan® with codeine for filling at a CVS pharmacy in Tucson, Arizona. The prescription had been written for “4” ounces, but Respondent had altered the prescription so that the “4” looked like an “8.”
 2. Phenergan® with codeine is a prescription-only drug as well as a schedule V controlled substance. A.R.S. § 36-2616(1)(a).

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CONCLUSIONS of LAW

1. The Board possesses jurisdiction over the subject matter and over Respondent pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-1901 *et seq.*
2. The Board may discipline a pharmacy technician who has engaged in unprofessional conduct. A.R.S. § 32-1927.01(A)(1).
3. The conduct described above constitutes unprofessional conduct pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-1901.01(C)(8) (“Violating a federal or state law or administrative rule relating to marijuana, prescription-only drugs, narcotics, dangerous drugs, controlled substances or precursor chemicals when determined by the board or by conviction in a federal or state court.”).
4. Respondent’s conduct described above constitutes a violation of A.R.S. § 32-1965(8) (It is illegal to make or offer to make a forged, counterfeit, altered or photocopied prescription or drug order for the purpose of obtaining prescription-only or controlled substance drugs).
